From Dr. Ellen Beck

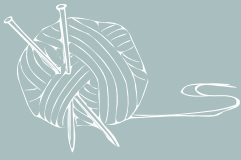

**How do you think your time with free clinic affects your practice now?**

First, I must say that my Free Clinic experience during my pre-medical years greatly influenced my decision to go into medicine, and my commitment to serve underserved populations in my career as a physician.

I learned some of the most important medical and life philosophies during my time at the Free Clinic, and I will never forget the 4 tenants we reminded ourselves during every clinic: humanistic, empowerment, transdisciplinary, and community as teacher. These are all incredibly important, but the two I find myself using quite often every day are humanistic and empowerment.

In these times of COVID, how have you and your patients found ways to persist?

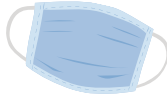
The COVID-19 pandemic has certainly been tough for everyone I know, but especially for our patients. We have found creative ways to continue seeing one another without trying to increase potential exposure to COVID. Our video and telephone visits have increased significantly, though we run into technical difficulties from

In 2020, there were **3,411** patient encounters!

With the transition to online visits due to COVID-19, 2020 was the year that challenged the Free Clinic team to meet the needs, current and new, of our patients. With quality of care at the forefront of our efforts, we're happy to report these clinic outcomes.

Pharmacy Drive-Thru Flu Shot Clinic

- **Vaccinated 160 of our patients** thanks to our pharmacy team!

*Telemedicine Visits*

- **100%** of patients rated their telemedicine experience as **"good"**
- **98%** of patients were **overall satisfied** with their telemedicine visit
- **85%** of patients met **CDC criteria for "high risk"**
- **34-44%** of encounters were **video visits**

*Food and Medicine Deliveries*

- Delivered an average of **35 food and med deliveries/week**
- Distributed a total of **8,500 lbs of food/month**
- **No cases of COVID-19 transmission** at the clinic or as a result of deliveries

Curriculum Development

Haley Moss, a second year medical student, created a **compassion curriculum** for our Free Clinic elective, FPM 272. Its implementation focused on strengthening not only **students' empathy for patients but also their self-compassion for themselves**. In doing so, a framework is established to help students sustainably strive to become the best physicians possible.

Erin Buckner, a second year medical student, developed and incorporated group projects, discussions, and lessons, focused on **actively being anti-racist** in the **Free Clinic setting** and in **our future practices**. This was a huge addition to Free Clinic's impact on student education and our mission to become better health and social advocates for our patients.

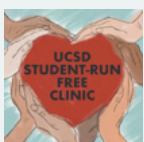
Anything you would tell your medical school self if you could?
